Your proposal to present your paper, program, panel, poster, as single author or in co-authorship, should focus on the following themes and adhere to the criteria outlined in the [submission form](#).

Our Summit focusses on these themes, including Student Affairs in relation to Social Justice:

1. Explore **Sustainable** Practices: Explore sustainable practices and initiatives that can be implemented within educational institutions to promote environmental, social, and economic responsibility. We focus on universities and organizations as laboratories for sustainable change like NetZero, climate action, sustainable cities, and micro-mobility. The ESG ranking system can be considered as higher education institutions, government agencies, and organizations promoting environmental, social, and economic responsibility.
2. Enhance Student **Engagement**: Identify strategies to enhance student engagement, involvement, and leadership within educational institutions, enabling them to become active participants in driving sustainable change.
3. **Empower** Students: to become leaders and change agents through involvement in clubs, organizations, community service, leadership, and sustainability initiatives. We teach students the values, competencies, skills, and knowledge necessary to contribute to building a more sustainable society.
4. Promote **Inclusivity** and Diversity: Emphasise the importance of inclusivity and diversity within educational institutions and student affairs to ensure equitable access to opportunities and resources, and to foster an inclusive learning environment.
5. Encourage **Innovation** and Technology: Highlight the role of innovation, technology, and digital transformation in revolutionizing educational institutions and student affairs, leading to sustainable change.
6. Address **Mental Health** and Well-being: Recognise the significance of mental health and well-being in the educational journey and explore strategies to create supportive and resilient environments that prioritize the holistic development of students.
7. Advocate **Policy and Advocacy**: Discuss policy implications and advocacy efforts required to drive sustainable change within educational institutions, student affairs, and the wider education landscape.
8. Creating **Professionalization** and **Internationalization** opportunities among staff to equip and embolden staff to accelerate social justice and sustainability goals in their spaces, with students and institutions.
9. Inspire **Collaboration**: Foster an environment that encourages collaboration and the exchange of ideas among educators, administrators, policymakers, and student affairs professionals to drive sustainable change in educational institutions.

Presentation Types:

- Oral presentations time: 15 minutes (pre-recorded or in-person)

- Pecha-Kucha presentations (20 slides x 20 seconds) Presentation Time: 6 minutes 40 seconds (pre-recorded or in-person)
- Poster presentations

Poster Presentation:

In keeping with the theme of sustainability, participants may submit a poster in an electronic format. Posters will be on display for the duration of the Summit and will be published online as part of Summit proceedings.
